Spring
 Inspect gutters for winter damage or loose brackets. Remove leftover debris like twigs & leaves. Check for leaks and seal with gutter caulk if needed. Ensure downspouts are clear & direct water away from the foundation.
Summer
 Trim nearby trees to prevent clogging during storms. Flush gutters with a garden hose to test flow. Look for sagging areas or standing water that indicates poor drainage. Make sure splash blocks & extensions are secure.
Fall
 Clean out fallen leaves & debris before winter snow hits. Check seams & joints for separation or rust. Install gutter guards if needed to reduce future maintenance. Inspect roof edges for shingle granules that might clog gutters.
 Winter □ Remove ice dams or heavy snow buildup (carefully). □ Inspect for icicles that may indicate poor insulation or ventilation. □ Check for sagging gutters from snow weight. □ Ensure downspouts are not frozen or blocked.
When to DIY vs. Hire a Pro
 DIY When: You're comfortable working on a ladder & have proper safety equipment. Your gutters are single-story & easy to access. There's only light debris or buildup. You have the tools—gloves, scoop, hose, & sealant—for basic cleaning & repairs.
 Hire a Pro When: Your home has multiple stories or steep rooflines. You notice leaks, rust, or significant damage to the gutter system. There's mold, mildew, or water pooling near the foundation.
